Conference themes

- peacekeeping and peacebuilding;
- the protection of civilians during armed conflict (POC);
- post-conflict development and reconstruction;
- disaster relief management.

Submission of abstracts and panel proposals

The working language of the conference is English. As to encourage an informed dialogue, we welcome papers (5000-9000 words) by scholars and professionals from any discipline including but not limited to international relations, conflict studies, economics, law, political science, sociology, philosophy and cultural studies.
