How have the dual challenges of poverty and security threats been dealt with among different development partners – donors and recipients – of foreign aid? The Institute for Development and Human Security (IDHS) at Ewha Womans University has spearheaded this agenda for the last four years. Our research has highlighted that Asian donors are very different from Western donors in the way they utilize foreign aid. Here aid is referenced within the broader context of foreign capital transactions with development partners including aid, FDI, and trade. Furthermore, poverty and security threats are intertwined to present dire challenges to developing nations which in turn require creative solutions. Results have been varied: Asian nations including South Korea have been successful in overcoming the dual challenges while there are many more fragile states in Asia that continue to suffer from these challenges.

To foster a fruitful exchange on some of the key cases in Asia, we are pleased to welcome you to this special conference hosted by Ewha IDHS. We will focus on the Asian region, and raise the question as to whether Asian countries can help one another to solve the dual challenges of economic development and human security . This conference assembles well-established scholars and promising junior researchers in order to assess Asian experiences with reference to both successful and challenging cases. We look forward to the active engagement of all conference participants and hope to find an Asian solution that brings together development and human security.
